Learning Outcomes (Each must be met ONCE over the course of Jr/Sr years.) 2/3 maximum

Outcome	Description of outcome
1. Identify personal strengths and develop areas for growth	What did you become aware of during your experience? Were you good at something and found a strength that you have? Or, did you learn you need to improve on something? Explain.
2. Undertaken new challenges and develop new skills in the process	Was this a new challenge or skill for you? If so, explain. Or, is this something you already do, but you moved to a higher level or set a new goal? If so, explain.
3. Demonstrate how to initiate and plan a CAS experience	What planning did you have to put into this activity before you actually participated? Explain this planning.
4. Shown commitment and perseverance in CAS experiences	Was this something you attended regularly? (e.g. once each week all summer) If so, be sure to keep a log of dates and times.
5. Recognize the benefits of working collaboratively with others	Did you work with others? What was your contribution? What was the overall purpose? What did you learn during this process?
6. Engaged with issues of global significance	Was this an international project, or a global issue (environment, elderly) that you worked on locally? If so, explain. How does your experience benefit the world?
7. Recognize and consider the ethics of choices and actions	If you thought about something ethical during your experience, include this as part of your reflection. Show awareness of the potential and varied consequences of choices and actions.
